Hartpury College, our partners and other organisations offer a range of financial support packages to eligible students applying for our courses.

Bursary or grant: an amount of money that does not need to be repaid

Bursaries

Discretionary Learner Support bursary

Who qualifies? The fund is means-tested (dependent on household income) and priority is given to those on low income who would otherwise find it difficult to attend college. Household income must be under £25,000 per annum to qualify. Full awards, including education visits fee, books, equipment, meal allowance or transport for non-residential students

Vulnerable Learner bursary

Value of £1,200 per year of study

Who qualifies? Students who are defined as vulnerable include:

- in care
- care leavers
- receiving Income Support or Universal Credit because they are financial supporting themselves
- receiving Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments

The Guyll-Leng bursary

Value is variable based on needs

Who qualifies? Open to applicants from households with limited income and demanding circumstances wishing to study agriculture, animal, equine and related land-based subjects at a college level.

Jon Henson MBE bursary

Value of £1,000 per year of study

Who qualifies? Open to students who reside in the three counties of Gloucestershire, Herefordshire and Worcestershire and are studying agriculture or related subjects.

Martin Baber award

Value of £1,500

Who qualifies? The Martin Baber Award is an international work experience bursary, available to support currently enrolled Hartpury students who wish to study or work abroad within the agricultural sector.



Please note:

- Students studying A-Levels, Sports, Outdoor Adventure or Uniformed Public Services are not eligible to apply for Residential Bursary. In addition, if a student has a horse in Hartpury livery they will also not be eligible.
- All our bursaries are available for UK-based students only.



You can apply for Hartpury finance packages from 1 April in the same year you're joining us

*Hardship grants and loans do not open until 1 November after enrolment.

Advanced learner loan

Who qualifies?

- Aged 19 or over at the start of your course
- Enrolling onto a course at level 3 or 4, which includes: A-levels, Access to Higher Education Diplomas, other Diplomas and Certificates, Advanced Apprenticeships or Higher Apprenticeships
- A UK resident at the start of your course and for three years prior to the start of the course.

Additional support

Free meals

Students aged between 16 and 18 can apply for free meals at college, subject to eligibility checks.

Childcare

If you have a child and you are under the age of 20 on the day your course or learning programme begins, you can apply for childcare funding through Care to Learn. Students aged between 20-23 may also be eligible to receive help towards childcare costs.

Residential bursary

Residential Support Bursary can provide students with financial help towards their accommodation costs where a course is not available within a reasonable daily travelling distance of their home.
