Purpose



- To understand how the KS4 curriculum will be structured and what pathways will be available to students
- To understand the structure & content of each course
- To have enough information to take away and make an informed choice





The process takes approximately 4 weeks and includes:

- Year 9 Exams
- Full reports
- Conversations with class teachers
- Empowerment lessons
- Pre-Options Conference
- Work in form time looking at options





GCSEs and BTEC qualifications

- GSCE qualifications are graded from 9-1 (with 9 being the highest)
- A grade 5 is described as a 'strong pass' and a grade 4 is described as a 'standard pass'
- Assessment is based on a final examinations in most subjects.
- Some subjects have NEAs non-examination assessment (a replacement to coursework)
- Subject staff can give you specific details





GCSEs and BTEC qualifications

- BTEC qualifications are graded from a Level 1 Pass to a Level 2 Distinction
- Often a combination of classwork leading to an end of un it assessment in the form of an examination, an essay, a practical demonstration of skill or a video submission

Policy paper English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

Updated 18 December 2017

The EBacc refers to a combination of subjects that the government thinks is important for young people to study at GCSE.

It includes:

- English language and literature
- maths
- the sciences
- geography or history
- a language

A study by the Sutton Trust reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.

Research by the UCL Institute of Education shows that taking the EBacc enhances prospects for entering further education or employment.

- This could give you the opportunity to gain 5 qualifications in English, English literature, maths and combined science. With non-examination courses in Issues & Ethics and PE






Which pathway is right for **YOU**
